Math calendar + art element of **shape** = work of art about you!

Mosaic

- A piece of art or image made from assembling small pieces of colored glass, stone, or other materials

- NOTICE: Be on the lookout for objects we have learned about in math calendar, such as various shapes and their attributes!



Art Element: Shape

- A shape is an enclosed space defined by other elements of art, such as line.
- Using our math calendar, academic vocabulary, how is this artist using shape, or what shapes/attributes is this artist using in his mosaic?
- What does this tell me about how I can use math and shape in art?

Directions

- Create a mosaic that tells something about you or about something that is important to you using shapes and attributes from math calendar
- You must include AT LEAST 3 shapes in your mosaic, and you must write those three shapes on the back of your mosaic
- You can use other shapes that are not on the math calendar list but those cannot be a part of your 3
- Name must be on the back
- You may use black or white as your backdrop paper
- Image must be school appropriate

Continued...

- Angles and measurements do not have to be perfect, but they should look very accurate to the viewer
- To get right angles, use the corners of your construction paper because they are 90 degree angles
- Try to save paper as much as possible by sharing colored paper with others, putting your scraps in a basket on the counter, and re-using
- All construction paper must be thrown away off the floor and tabletops at the end of the art time
- You will need a scissor and a glue stick, and these must be put away at the end of the art time
- Everybody needs to be working at a <u>hard surface</u>, <u>voice level 0</u>

Remember

A mosaic is a piece of art or image made from assembling **small** pieces of colored glass, stone, or other materials
